Livestock Committee Junior Superintendent Requirements

Qualifications

- Be the ages of 16 to 20 as of the current fair year.
- Must be an active member of a Club registered with the Muskegon County Fair.
- Be able to fulfill a 1-year term as a Junior Superintendent of the Livestock Committee.
- Complete the Junior Superintendent application including parent/guardian consent.
- Have two signed letters of recommendation from a non-family member.

Responsibilities

- Be willing to promote the Muskegon Fair in a positive manner and as a positive educational opportunity for youth.
- Abide by the rules and the responsibilities as set forth for the Jr. Representative by the Muskegon County Livestock Committee.
- Maintain a professional and cooperative attitude with fairgoers, Livestock Committee members and Fair Board members as well as other fair volunteers.
- Use appropriate dress, behavior and language when representing the Muskegon County Fair.
- Support the decisions, policies and activities of the Fair Board and Livestock Committee.
- Attend a minimum of (6) Livestock Committee meetings.
- To perform, in a satisfactory and cooperative manner, all duties and tasks as assigned to him/her prior and/or during the week of Fair.
- Duties and tasks assigned to the Junior Representatives may vary greatly. Duties may include assisting/shadowing any Fair Board or Livestock Committee member in helping with or coordinating certain events and other duties as assigned.

Benefits to Junior Livestock Committee Representatives

- Be a part of the Muskegon County Fair while learning how the Fair works and the details of what it takes to put the event on each year.
- Learn and develop time management, communication, teamwork, leadership and goal setting skills.
- Learn to plan, prepare, cooperate and carry out certain fair events led by the Livestock Committee.
- Have a “voice” in improving the Muskegon County Fair and activities relating to it.

Code of Conduct – Dismissal

- Any Junior Representative member who does not perform his or her responsibilities to the satisfaction of the Muskegon County Livestock Committee, may be dismissed at any time prior to, or during, the Muskegon County Fair.
