


COUNT THE NUMBER OF HANDS ON EACH HORSE.


Years ago, men used their hands to measure horses. The average man's hand was 4" so this became the standard measurement when buying a horse. Today we still use the "hand" to measure a horse.


CURRY COMB - a metal or rubber tool with rows of teeth used to remove deep dirt and mud.




SHEDDING BLADE - a metal blade with teeth used to shed winter hair.



HOOF PICK - used to clean out the bottom of the horse's feet.




RUBBER GROOMING MITT - this fits over your hand and its used to remove mud and loose hair from the face and legs.



DANDY BRUSH - a stiff brush used to remove dirt from the body.



BODY or FACE BRUSH - a soft brush used on the face. Also used to polish the body hair.



MANE AND TAIL COMB - used to comb out the mane and tail.
